

The Iceberg Problem: Looking Below the Surface



Leaders are often pressured to solve the problem they can immediately see. The visible issue demands attention, but it is rarely the whole problem.

The iceberg reminds us that what sits above the surface is only a fraction of what influences the outcome. Beneath every immediate issue are assumptions, constraints, relationships, process decisions, and ripple effects that often determine success or failure.

Quick fixes may relieve today's pressure, but lasting solutions come from understanding the larger picture before acting. Better questions reveal deeper causes. Better understanding produces better decisions.

Looking below the surface doesn't slow progress—it improves it.
